#### MUST TRY: CHICKEN KWAY TEOW SOUP

Nothing hits the spot like a piping hot bowl of soup. Known locally as Kai See Hor Fun, at this local institution, silken flat rice noodles are drowned in a flavourful but light prawn broth and garnished with a generous helping of tender chicken slices, fresh prawns and spring onions. Do as the locals do and get there early to partake.

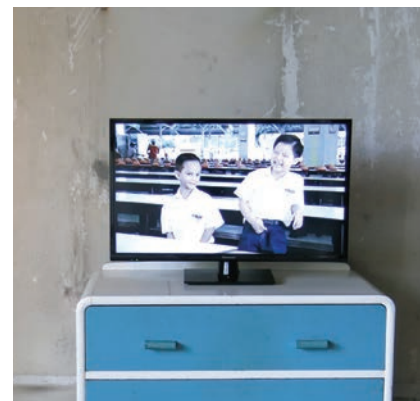
## Do

**STREET ART**

It's not just Penang that Ernest Zacharevic has left his mark on. Commissioned by Ipoh Old Town, the Lithuanian artist has portraits of a coffee-sipping Uncle to kids riding a paper plane, tin mining scenes and hovering hummingbirds hidden in the back lanes and up on high around the city. Keep your eyes peeled.

**IPOH HERITAGE WALK**

A leisurely 6.5 kilometre stroll around the old town will bring Ipoh's history to life. Start at the train station where the tree that the city is named after stands; wander past the stately High Court and Town Hall to the Birch Memorial Clock Tower, then make your way to the old CBD where the grand Chartered Bank and former Straits Trading Company buildings stand. End at the Ipoh Club, which overlooks the field opposite the beautiful St Michael's Institution and the humble green as well as white Padang Mosque.

**YASMIN @ KONG HENG**

A permanent tribute to the talented copywriter, film director and creative director Yasmin Ahmad, this lovingly curated 2-room space features photos of Yasmin's work space, a TV playing Yasmin's ad reel on loop and screenings of her films - among them *Sepet*, which was shot in Ipoh. Although originally from Muar, Yasmin had a soft spot for the city and after getting to know Ipoh, you will too.



# Ipoh Road Trip

Enroute to Ipoh and need to stretch your legs? These towns harbour some fascinating curiosities worthy of discovery.



## BATU GAJAH

### STOP FOR: KELLIE'S CASTLE

*Location: 25km from Ipoh*

Construction of the unfinished, ruined extension of Scottish planter William Kellie Smith's mansion ended abruptly in 1926 when Kellie Smith died of pneumonia. Romantics weave a tale of a gift for his family haunted by ghostly apparitions, but anyone who visits will marvel at its recently restored grandness and colonial, Moorish, and Tamilvanan Indian architecture.



## KUALA KANGSAR

### STOP FOR: UBUDIAH MOSQUE

*Location: 41km from Ipoh*

Atop Bukit Chandan, the royal heart of Kuala Kangsar, sits Ubudiah Mosque. Commissioned by Sultan Idris in 1913 and designed by prolific British government draughtsman Arthur Benison Hubback, its exotic minarets, Moorish arches and gilded domes are mesmerising. Dress modestly (headscarves, covered shoulders, covered legs) and you can tour this religious site in between prayer times.



## GOPENG

### STOP FOR: WHITE WATER RAFTING

*Location: 17km from Ipoh*

The crystal clear water and cascades of Kampar River make for suitable navigation for anyone physically fit and up for adventure. Various extreme sports groups operate in the area and rapids are graded from class I to III. From the rush of the river to the serene beauty of a gentle paddle through lush rainforest, white water rafting here is an invigorating jolt to the body and brain.



## TANJUNG MALIM

### STOP FOR: YIK MUN PAU

*Location: 119km from Ipoh*

Founded in 1926 by Kok Ee Chun, a first generation Hainanese immigrant, Yik Mun is the legendary kopitiam home of what was once Malaysia's best pau. Today it's a small industry, made by machine and subsequently frozen for distribution, but its fillings – chicken, beef, red bean and kaya among them – remain a firm favourite and the perfect tea-time accompaniment.

# MOUTHWATERING MELAKA

Great food can inspire you to jump in your car and cross state lines. There's more to Melaka's historic city besides its famed Nyonya cuisine. If you've done the chicken rice balls, had your fill of *pai tee* and scoffed your last pineapple tart, get ready to let your appetite lead the way to these unexpected food finds.



## MELAKA'S SWEET SIDE

Palm sugar is widely available but the best comes from Melaka. Made from palm sugar boiled down to a thick brown syrup and poured into a bamboo mould until it hardens, its sweet smoky flavour lends itself well to creamy desserts and traditional treats.

Keep it old school and enjoy arguably the best cendol in town at **JONKER 88**. Shaved ice, coconut milk and dark syrupy molasses of palm sugar - hold the beans! **88 Jalan Hang Jebat, Bandar Hilir, Melaka.**

**THE DAILY FIX** drizzles their palm sugar over pandan pancakes, sprinkled with coconut for eats meets west that's a match made in dessert heaven. **55 Jalan Hang Jebat, Bandar Hilir, Melaka.**



## EAT @ 18

### COME FOR THE: BAKED GOODS

Hidden by greenery, this calm oasis away from the hustle and bustle of Jonker Street serves up the town's best bread. Baked fresh daily, their artisanal loaves and buns are organic and free of preservatives. Order up their French toast for breakfast or drop by for the scones in the afternoon.

**CALANTHE ART CAFÉ****COME FOR THE: COFFEE**

Connoisseurs of coffee seeking to savour Malaysia's best joe can rest assured that they will find a cuppa to satisfy here. Calanthe serves up 13 varieties, one for each state (excluding Federal Territories). The flavours are as diverse as the states themselves; sip on yours while you take in the eclectic surroundings.

**VEGGIE PLANET****COME FOR THE: VEGGIE ASAM PEDAS**

Run by the same people as Melaka's Geographer Café, Veggie Planet serves up familiar Malaysian meals but using plant-based ingredients. You won't have to forgo local favourites like *asam pedas* and *Nyonya laksa* here. Free of MSG, artificial colours, flavours and preservatives, and with not a morsel of mock meat in sight, the food is fresh and bursting with flavour.

**BABOON HOUSE****COME FOR THE: BURGERS**

Like a secret society, The Baboon House looks intriguing but doesn't immediately appear inviting and no photos are allowed. The ambience is friendly and the food is good. Burgers are piled high with a thick homemade patty, lashings of other fresh ingredients and portions are hefty. The Spicy Lamb Burger goes down a treat.

**LIMAU-LIMAU CAFÉ****COME FOR THE: FRESH JUICES**

One of the first cafes to bust out of the mold, Limau-Limau's hole in the wall is a jewellery box treasure of retro furniture and kooky art pieces. Their sandwiches get a thumbs up but the real draw are their freshly blitzed blended juices and shakes. Try the dragonfruit version.

## AUNTIE AINI'S GARDEN CAFÉ ●

**MUST TRY: GULAI DAGING SALAI MASAK LEMAK CILI API**

Presided over by the feisty Auntie Aini, this *kampung*-style restaurant has played host to celebrity chefs like Anthony Bourdain and Gordon Ramsay. Serving up mostly home-cooked Malay-Negeri Sembilan fare, the *gulai daging salai masak lemak cili api*, *sambal tempoyak daun kayu* and *kerabu pucuk paku* are highly recommended and super spicy. **Batu 16, Kampung Chelet, Nilai, Negeri Sembilan.**

## BEEF NOODLES, STALL 742

**MUST TRY: BEEF NOODLES**

Located in one of the oldest landmarks in Seremban, the beef noodles at Stall 742 is a heady combination of tender beef chunks, handmade noodles, preserved cabbage chunks and peanuts in thick gravy, perfected over 60 years. **Pasar Besar Seremban, Jalan Tuanku Munawir, Seremban, Negeri Sembilan.**

## RESTAURANT REMBAU RIA ●

**MUST TRY: MASAK LEMAK**

Serving up authentic, freshly-cooked Negeri specialties, most of which are fiery hot, there are over 20 dishes to choose from here and that doesn't include sides like fried *tempeh*, *bergedil* (a savoury potato patty), hard-boiled salted duck eggs and crispy fried fish. The liberal use of *kampung* and jungle produce in Rembau Ria's cooking is a special treat.

## YIT HIN HAINAN CHICKEN RICE

**MUST TRY: CHICKEN RICE**

This unassuming stall whips up one heck of a Hainanese chicken rice. Made using free-range chicken and seasoned perfectly with thick sweet soy sauce, as well as piquant chili and ginger sauce, get here early or risk having no lunch at all.

## LUCKY SEAFOOD RESTAURANT

**MUST TRY: CURRY CHICKEN KING BUN**

Who needs a pot when you can bake your lunch right into a bun? That's exactly what the curry chicken king bun achieves. Crack it open, let the fragrance of curry spices wash over you, then yank off some of that bread and soak it up. Delicious and no washing up involved after. Win!

# HIT THE HILLS

The sun is shining, the wind is blowing. So what are you doing indoors? Get in your car, get outdoors and get on top of the world. Here are 4 great Malaysian mountain hikes from easy to tough near you that you can complete in a day.

## PENANG HILL, 783 METERS

TIME TO PEAK: 2 TO 3 HOURS

RATING: MODERATE

The location of pre-independence Malaya's first hill resort, Penang Hill is not one hill but a collection of peaks, and at 783 meters Bukit Bendera or Flagstaff Hill in Penang is not to be sniffed at. There are multiple ways to get to its peak. For a real challenge, take the Moon Hill entrance at the Botanical Gardens up the punishing set of stairs to Rest Stop 5's outdoor gym, then along the kinder trails with scenic views of the island, until you emerge at the winding tar road. There's still half an hour of steep ascents to go past the colonial bungalows. By the time you get to the top, you'll deserve your plate of fish and chips at David Brown's.

### When did u start hiking?

When I was 15 I hiked up Gunung Pulai in Johor. Have had the urge since.

### What has hiking taught you?

How to better appreciate the outdoors and nature. There's nothing like escaping the city.

### Where have you hiked?

All across Malaysia, in Pahang and Negeri Sembilan mostly. My regular training ground used to be Bukit Puchong. But I've also had the chance to climb the mountains of Taiwan and Indonesia.

### What has been your greatest hiking achievement?

At the end of 2014 I conquered Annapurna Base Camp, ABC for short. It's the base camp to the 10th highest mountain in the world.

### What is your dream hike?

I'm looking forward to eventually hiking the hills and mountains of Norway. It's a beautiful country. The climate and the opportunity to catch a view of the Aurora Borealis would be amazing.



**GUNUNG TOK WAN, 675M**  
**TIME TO PEAK: 2 TO 3 HOURS**

**RATING: MODERATE**

The journey to the peak of Gunung Tok Wan on the Negeri Sembilan border involves two hikes that are almost polar opposites. The first up the barren slope of Broga Hill is usually attempted under the cover of night to catch the sunrise. But why stop there when you can continue through the undulating jungle terrain and take the summit of Gunung Tok Wan.

**GUNUNG NUANG, 1493M**  
**TIME TO PEAK: 3 TO 4 HOURS**

**RATING: TOUGH**

Gunung Nuang in Pahang has two approaches, the short and tough Janda Baik (Pahang) approach and the long and arduous Pangsun (Selangor) approach. The uninitiated should start with Janda Baik. A wander through vegetable farms eventually leads you into the forest, across a river and past a waterfall before the going gets tough.

The Pangsun route requires a very long walk before several stream crossings and a killer climb. The view at the top is the same whichever route you opt for as both ways meet at the peak lush and green, be sure to inhale in that refreshing mountain air.



## FIVE EASY STEPS TO STRESS FREE DRIVING



### STEP 1

#### FIX YOUR BACK SUPPORT

Make sure you sit up straight, with your buttocks and back square as well as being completely squeezed into the seat. This helps to avoid backaches, possible back injuries and maintains awareness during long drives.



### STEP 2

#### ADJUST YOUR HEADREST

Place the headrest to a height just above your eyelids and as close to your head as possible, between 2 to 3 centimetres.



### STEP 3

#### KEEP YOUR EYES AT THE SAME LEVEL

Adjust the seat height. This should allow you to see forward clearly with a view of the dashboard, and proper height relative to the wheel and pedals. Now recheck your feet.



### STEP 4

#### MAKE FREQUENT STOPS

You may be sitting down but even that can be tiring. Long highways can also be monotonous and in the hot Malaysian climate, lead to drowsiness. Look for rest stops at which to get out and stretch.



### STEP 5

#### BE A TECH HEAD

With the advent of GPS maps and navigational tools like Waze, it's easier than ever to plan your route, anticipate tailbacks, save time and energy, as well as avoid stressful situations like running low on petrol with no petrol station in sight. Use them to plan ahead.

### GUNUNG SANTUBONG, 810 METERS TIME TO PEAK: 4 HOURS

#### RATING: TOUGH

Located 35 kilometres outside of Kuching, Gunung Santubong in Sarawak is no slouch. Its tougher route is long and challenging, but it's also sufficiently varied to keep the adventurous hiker guessing. Gentle at first, you'll traverse through lush rainforest, once you're past the halfway mark, be prepared for vertical rock faces and steep gradients surmountable only by knotted rope and rope ladders. It's all part of the fun and for your effort, you'll be rewarded along the way with burbling streams, beautiful waterfalls and some breathtaking views.

**RATING: PG13**

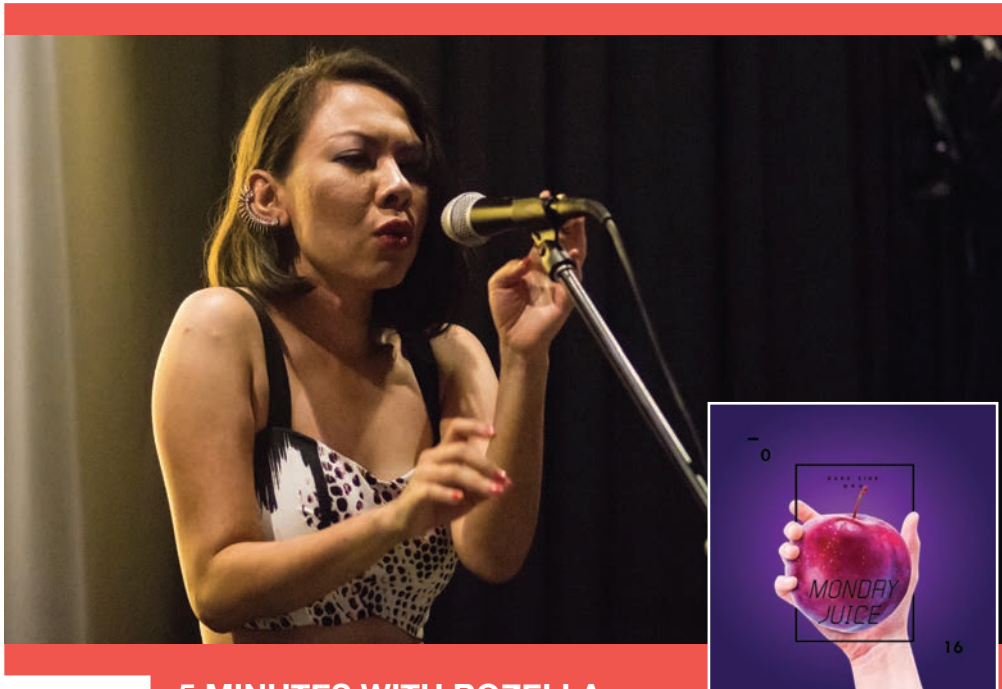

**For the longest time, you were afraid of the limelight. Why is that?**

I have a birthmark on my face. Being on stage and having someone look at me was a very scary thing for me. It took me a while to finally find the courage to actually say "You know what? This is what I want to do."

**You're spearheading a passion project called True Complexion, which celebrates diversity while raising awareness about various medical conditions. Has making music been therapeutic for you?**

Definitely. I started out in the beginning writing really sad songs and really angry songs; it was an emotional outlet. The stuff that's coming out now is a bit lighter, a bit happier.

**How do you find inspiration?**

I believe in the whole theory that John Lennon subscribes to – inspiration is spinning around in this huge vortex, so if you're tuned in,

the moment just comes to you, it flows. But if you're distracted, the idea goes elsewhere.

**What's playing in the car when you're on the road?**

Right now I'm really into Solange's new album, A Seat At The Table.

**What is your dream?**

For True Complexion, I definitely want to expand what we have, grow more stories, and make it a global movement. There are a lot of countries that have specific stories, like acid burn victims in India.

**Who would be your dream collaboration?**

Ta-ku would be one. Flume is also an artist whose sound I really like. Locally, Shelhiel. We've met already, so let's see what happens!

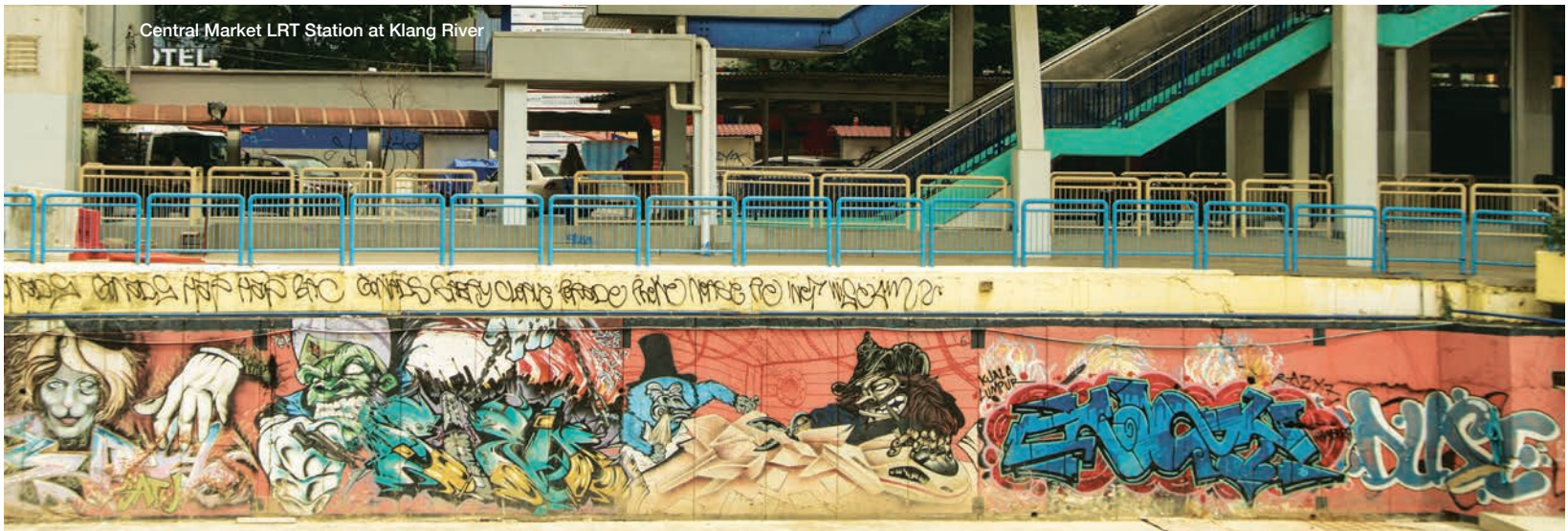
