## Treasures of The South

Explore the timeless jewels of Negeri Sembilan, Melaka and Johor for a touch of culture, history and adventure

### THE MINANGKABAU CHARM

Discover the rich Sumatran influence in the culture, buildings and language of Negeri Sembilan.

Negeri Sembilan, home to the Minangkabau culture, is famous for its unique roofline architecture. The city features several grand colonial buildings that provide the perfect backdrop to the modern capital city of Seremban. The Sri Menanti Palace is one of the few remaining palaces built entirely using timber. It is raised two metres off the ground and stands on 99 pillars; this beauty is the handiwork of two talented craftsmen; Tukang Kahar and Tukang Taib. The palace serves as a museum displaying royal insignia from customary clothing, traditional weapons,

furniture and rare personal items of the royal family's. Discover ornate, conventional touches of Negeri Sembilan through the detailing in the exterior and interior façade of the palace.

Negeri Sembilan State Mosque is built overlooking the picturesque view of the Seremban Lake. The structure of the mosque depicts the nine charming districts that make up the state of Negeri Sembilan. It encompasses nine pillars that stand tall in each corner of the curved Minangkabau roofline unique to the state. The design of the mosque offers the

juxtaposition of contemporary wooden decorative with walls painted in elegant white.

The Craft Complex is a 100-year-old building and one of its most cherished treasures. Formerly serving as the Land Office, the complex enlightens guests on the rich history and heritage of the state. The complex houses three distinct galleries; the craft gallery, heritage gallery, and craft shop. A fun way to gain knowledge is by participating in their "Craft Demo" and watch the beguiling "Cultural Performance" scheduled monthly.

The Seremban State Secretariat (Negeri Sembilan State Library) building was erected as a monolith and designed by A.B Hubback. It is a regal colonial mansion with

big arches and windows. Take a walk around the building to commemorate our ancestors who had fought during the insurgency faced by Malaya and served as a remembrance to us on how far our nation has progressed.

Immerse yourself with the knowledge of the Minangkabau culture in The Negeri Sembilan State Museum. The museum serves to preserve and reflect the traditions and characteristics of Negeri Sembilan through its roof architecture which are peaked at both ends to symbolise the horns of a water buffalo. Other paraphernalia and exhibitions explain the adherence to adat pepatih (matrilineal inheritance) which is only practiced by the Minangkabau community.

### OF COLONIAL LEGACIES

One of the main trading hubs of the peninsula in the 15th century, Melaka ignites curiosity over tales of warriors and worldly visitors.

Melaka is renowned for being the melting pot of culture through its colonial influence from the Dutch, Portuguese and British as well as the influx of traders from China. As a result of the amalgamation of all these cultures, Melaka is rich with heritage and was recognised as a UNESCO World Heritage site. Begin your journey at the iconic Christ Church built in 1753 situated at the Dutch Square as the locals call it. Its unique construction bore no nails and sitting majestically on the steeple is a weathercock, an uncommon addition to a church. As one of the oldest church outside of Europe, the cathedral interior has 200-year-old handmade pews, decorative fanlights, and plaques which are mesmerising.

Widely known as the famous red building over the Melaka River promenade, The Stadthuys was built in 1650 serving as the

official residence for the Dutch governors and officers. The building has seen numerous changes over the years, and in 1982 the building was converted into the Museum of History & Ethnography. Be enriched by the understanding of local Melaka customs and traditions as well as the decadent history of the great rulers of the Malay Sultanate as well as the Portuguese, Dutch and British occupation.

Make your way through hilly, green pathways to St. Paul's Hill and be in awe of the amazing

view of Melaka City. The ruins of the exterior and interior reflect the loss of war during the colonial era while the intricacy in the details of the tombstone and the well-preserved statue of St. Francis Xavier is an impressive sight. Fascinating tales of the loss of his hand ignites some curiosity.

The glory of the Kingdom of Melaka is familiar to Malaysians. The Melaka Sultanate Palace Museum is an ideal way to discover the history of the Melaka Sultanate. The museum

is a wooden replica of Sultan Mansur Shah's 15th-century palace, and the highlights depict the lives of the Sultans and history of their mighty Kingdom.

Sam Poh Kong Temple located at the foothills of Bukit Cina was built in 1795. The quaint temple was named after the legendary journey made by Admiral Cheng Ho during a storm where the sam poh fish plugged a leaking hole in his sinking ship. Visit the temple to appreciate the wall paintings, beautiful tiling and elaborate roofline.

The vivid experience of Jonker Walk's night market on Friday to Sunday from 6pm onwards is not to be missed. The walk flanked between beautiful heritage homes is your one-stop destination to find souvenirs, antiques, textiles, handicrafts and satisfying street snacks.



## THE SOUTHERN GEM

The gateway to the south, Johor breathes a fusion of heritage and progression worth exploring.

Johor Bahru is the second largest city in Malaysia and is laden with heritage right at the heart of the city. Start your heritage trail from Royal Abu Bakar Museum (The Grand Palace of Johor). The palace was built in the year 1866 and later turned into a museum. It houses some of the rarest artifacts including the Sultan's stunning range of weapon collection and several personal items of the Royal Family that is exquisite to observe. Take a peek into the life of the royals and journey through the showcase of historical events which will enrich your understanding of the history of Johor.

Perched on the hilltops, the Sultan Abu Bakar Mosque that stands grandiose overlooking the Johor Straits and Singapore is regarded as one of the most beautiful mosques in Malaysia. The amalgamation of Victorian and Islamic architecture is truly iconic and unique to Johor Bahru. The park landscape surrounding the grand mosque adds to its serenity.

Business opportunities brought together many traders and immigrants to Johor Bahru. The Johor Bahru Chinese Heritage Museum offers an insight of the Chinese community in Johor Bahru from their origins to the breakdown of different dialects; Hainanese, Cantonese, Hakka, Hokkien, and Teochew which correlates to the various trades they were brought in to work. The Museum provides headphones with video players

to supplement all the information while browsing through the three-storey building.

The Sultan Ibrahim Building holds the distinction as one of the tallest building before independence. The regal architecture stemming from western and eastern influence is one of Johor Bahru's iconic

landmarks. The unique structure and design of the building make it one of the most photographed buildings in the city. Until 2009, the building was used as the State Secretariat building before relocating to the administrative capital of Kota Iskandar.

The Johor Bahru High Court building is one for history

lovers as the building features colonial architecture. The classic construction of the stark white building with a fountain and monument bearing Johor's coat of arms is an imagery you would come across in literature from the Renaissance. The building in all its splendour was replicated using Lego at Legoland Malaysia.

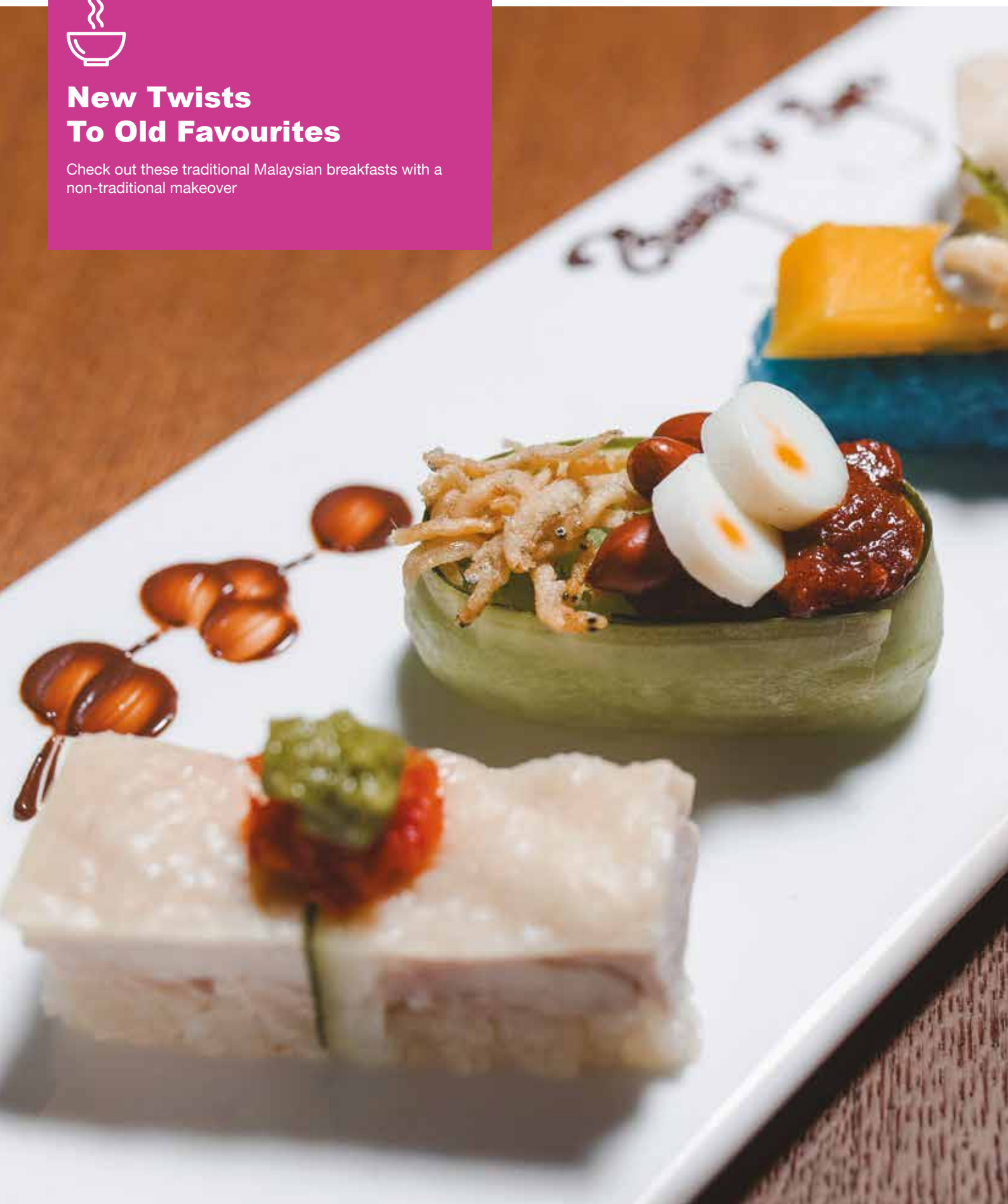

### What's your favourite Malaysian breakfast?

I like all Malaysian breakfasts. One day I would have coconut rice with beef rendang, and the next day Indian paratha with dhal, thosai with coconut chutney or dim sum and chicken pao. Roti bakar is one of my favourite picks: I typically eat it with kaya.

### Tips for a tasty but healthy breakfast?

Malaysian breakfasts lean more towards taste instead of health. Go for Australian wheat-bix with bananas. A significant advantage of Malaysian cuisine is the diversity, so choose different breakfast options on a weekly basis to get as many nutrients as possible.

### Most expensive breakfast you've ever prepared?

That would be a caviar and champagne breakfast at the Per Aquum Huaven Fushi hotel in Maldives. It starts with a bottle of Chrystal, followed by Beluga caviar with condiments and berries. Guests could also have fried eggs with truffles, French pastries, and quality jams. The complete breakfast cost approximately 300 USD per person.

### Your take on Malaysian-Western fusion cuisine for breakfast?

I find it quite bizarre to eat everything mixed, which usually happens in the hotels. Travellers seek to try different and new dishes simultaneously. However, I think in Malaysia everybody can eat how he wants and explore new flavours.



### DEEP FRIED MASHED POTATO DUMPLINGS

Fans of the deep-fried Taro (yam) dumplings will find that this particular option substitutes the meat and mushroom stuffing of Taro dumplings with a thick helping of delicious fried mashed potatoes. The dumplings are placed in a plate of syrupy sweet and sour sauce, and are each sprinkled lightly with spring onions. They are crispy on the outside with a soft and subtle taste on the inside. Give your usual dim sum breakfast a modern twist and savour this delectable treat at the spacious pool-side restaurant, Ti Chen.

### AERIAL ARTS

Depending on fabric for support, the aerial silks allow people of all ability levels to stretch, balance and exercise. According to Flyoga founder, Reiko Shalini Soo, a soft hammock partially or fully supports the body in performing various aerial adaptations of traditional yoga poses. The fabric hammock allows you to surrender to the force of gravity, allowing the body to relax. This fabric hammock, which usually supports weight up to 500kgs, assists in alignment and often brings an understanding to a particular pose that you were not willing to attempt before especially inversions.

**TRAMPOLINE WORKOUTS**

The fitness craze is all the rage at the gyms and can be replicated at home. The trampoline provides an exercise workout that helps shed calories and boosts cardio without any stress on your joints. A 10-minute workout on the trampoline is equivalent to 30 minutes on the treadmill with 40 per cent less impact. Do a 20-minute muscle-toning cardio workout a day. It helps build, tone and tighten core strength as effectively as you would when you run. For example, try sitting on the trampoline and jumping up to standing position, maintaining your balance as you do it. Do other variations from the basic bounce to trampoline squats and prances.

### What type of skill level does it take to do aerial yoga?

No prior skills or experience of any sort is needed as aerial yoga [flyoga] is a low impact exercise and is beginner friendly.

### What are the benefits of aerial yoga vs. normal yoga?

Doing inversions like a handstand and headstand are easier and safer. You can achieve more poses. Spine decompression allows the spine to lengthen and vertebrae to decompress. You will also achieve better core and flexibility.

### What does a standard aerial yoga class involve?

Class kicks off with a 10 - 15 minutes warm-up session in a flow of traditional and aerial yoga poses. You may expect to sweat and stretch to the max during the warm up itself.

Be prepared to do at least one aerial based pose or inversion each class. Class ends with a photo session of achieving poses and finally with a Shavasana session.

### What obstacles would Aerial yoga help you overcome?

Fear - most definitely. As being inverted and off the ground is not a norm in our everyday life. Once you have experienced it, you not only overcome the fear, but you gain confidence as well.

Depression - unlike the ways of the traditional yoga in helping depression, it's very natural in an aerial yoga class to cultivate friendship and teamwork. Being relaxed and enjoying the session opens your heart to new friends and a new social circle.

Get some road trip inspiration – and laughs – from some Hollywood’s most memorable offerings

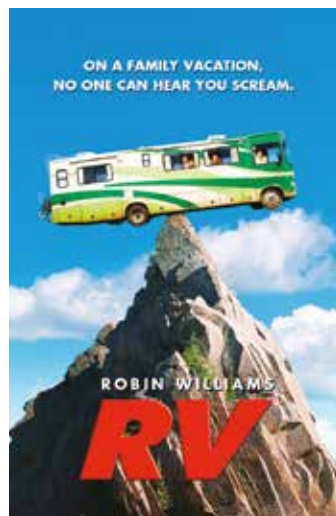
## LITTLE MISS SUNSHINE (2006)

### • Spin A Tale

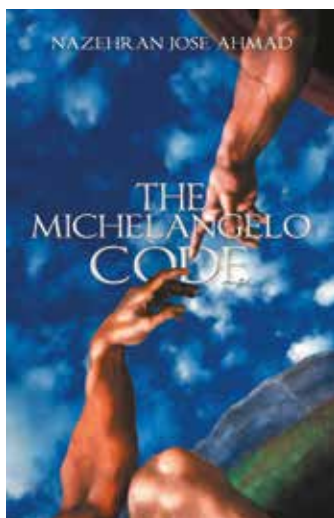

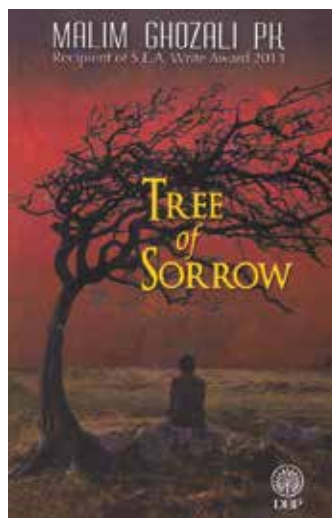

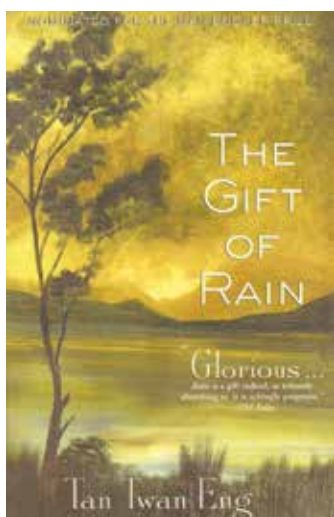
## THE MICHELANGELO CODE NAZEHRAN JOSE AHMAD

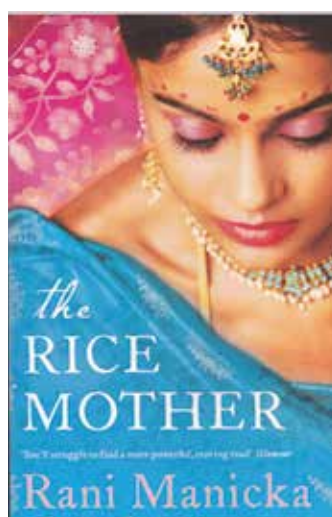
## TREE OF SORROW MALIM GHOZALI PK

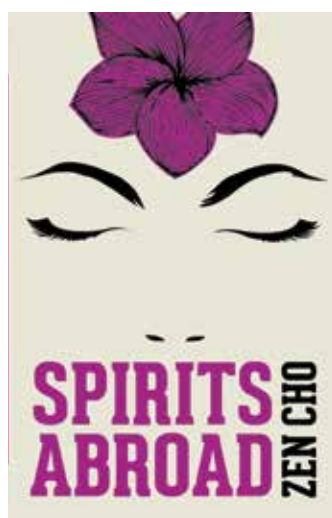
## THE RICE MOTHER RANI MANICKA

The song marks the first-ever heavy metal song recorded and fast became a road biker soundtrack. The heavy metal categorisation came from the use of "heavy metal thunder" in the lyrics, marking the first time the term was ever used. It was first featured in the classic film "Easy Rider" and went on to be featured prominently in a dozen movies and TV shows.



### WHERE THE STREETS HAVE NO NAME U2

The song that reached Number 4 on the UK charts and was not the easiest to record given the complexity of its music, originating from a demo by The Edge done in his home. The song talks about how a person's income and religion is ascertained from the street they live on in Belfast. Lead singer Bono wrote this in contrast to how the anonymity he felt when he visited Ethiopia, writing it out on an air sickness bag on the flight back.



### JACK & DIANE JOHN COUGAR

A song about a high school couple falling in love and progressing through life doing the best they can. A tribute to life in the rural working class, Jack and Diane became an American couple most could relate to. Many have approached the singer to claim they are living the lives of Jack & Diane. It was John Mellencamp's only No 1 hit with heavy influences from Mick Ronson to whom he always said he owed the song's success. The video for this song showed personal home videos and photos of John as a kid.



### SHUT UP & DRIVE RIHANNA

A guitar-driven track, this song shows off the Barbadian jewel's rockier side. Infectious like its predecessor, Umbrella, the song talks about how she wants someone to just drive her around in her new wheels. Well, that is if you don't pay any attention to the double entendres, as she uses cars as a metaphor. It became the fifth top five single for Rihanna and peaked within the Top10 in 9 countries. The video was shot in Prague, the Czech Republic where Rihanna performs the song in a makeshift junkyard.



### LITTLE RED CORVETTE PRINCE

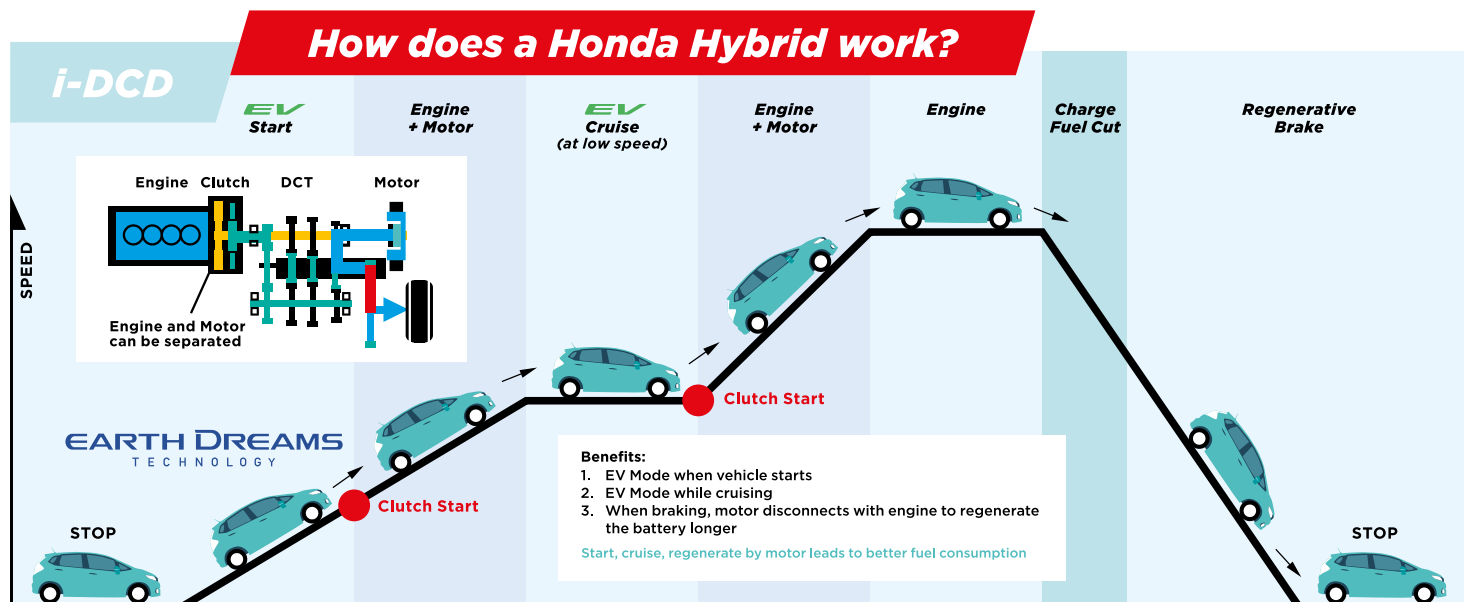

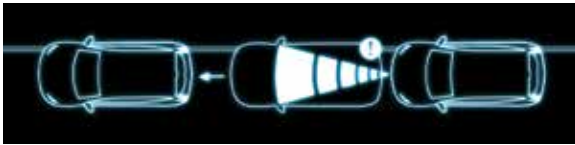
