here's no denying the lure of Japan. The country has seen a massive spike in Malaysian tourists to the country – an impressive 11.5% between 2016 and 2017, with Malaysians ranking eighth worldwide in the number of visitors to Japan. That's nearly half a million Malaysians visiting the country in 2018. For those who haven't had a chance to explore Japan's impressive cities and bucolic countryside, or perhaps you're between trips, there's a little slice of Japan you can get here in Malaysia to satisfy that wanderlust.

THE JAPANESE VILLAGE, BERJAYA HILLS

Nestled in the hills and peaks of Bukit Tinggi in Pahang, Berjaya Hills is home to two transplanted settings: Colmar Tropicale, a hotel and series of shops, restaurants and cafés inspired by the quaint villages of Alsace France; and the Japanese Village.

With the cooler weather of Banjaran Titiwangsa's highlands, it's not a stretch of the imagination to believe you could be in Japan. Consisting of a series of Japan-themed attractions, the Japanese Village features a Japanese teahouse, spa, restaurant and a luxury suite, should you choose to stay the night.

With traditional Japanese architecture and features such as sliding *shoji* doors and *tatami* flooring, the Ume Tatami Suite is the only accommodation available within the Japanese Village, which makes this an exclusive opportunity to experience what traditional countryside living is like in Japan, right here in Malaysia. Consisting of three *washitsu* or Japanese-styled rooms that are minimally decorated, the simple

living and dining spaces are converted into bedrooms at night and can accommodate eight guests comfortably.

Day-trippers will love it here too. Wander between the rock pools and koi ponds filled with beautiful carp fish in the tranquil woodland setting. Though the shrubs and plants are of a different species to those found in Japan, it was designed by Japanese landscape artists to recreate the aesthetics of a traditional Japanese garden. Just as tourists do in Japan, rent and don a *kimono* or *yukata* for convincing photo opportunities.

If you book ahead, you can participate in a traditional tea ceremony at the *chashitsu* or Japanese tearoom. Those seeking a deeper sense of relaxation can immerse themselves at the Tatami Spa. Adopting the Japanese philosophy of *furo*, or bathing for relaxation and rejuvenation, this is combined with treatments such as a massage, body scrub and reflexology in one of four rooms themed according to each season. Alternately, eschew an indoor spa experience for the ultimate in *shinyin-roku* or forest bathing; at its outdoor *onsen* hot water is pumped into a sunken bath so you can languish in the open under the jungle canopy.

Make sure you grab a bite to eat before you go. Ryo Zan Tei is an intimate Japanese restaurant set within four acres of highland forest. Enjoy a *bento* box before exploring the one-kilometre long cemented trail that winds its way through the trees and surrounding botanical garden.

The Fusion Revolution

The marriage between the clean flavours, seasonal ingredients and minimalist presentation of Japanese cuisine and the spicy, often pungent taste profiles of Malaysian gastronomy seems an unlikely combination for fusion food, but sometimes opposites really do attract.

When it comes to eating out, Japanese food has garnered a huge following in Malaysia. Besides the sushi restaurants and ramen joints that we've taken to with gusto, we are also quick to jump on the latest food fads that filter in from the Far East, like Japanese cheesecake and Calpis. Yum! However, if you're really interested in broadening your culinary horizons, you should try the intriguing though strangely familiar taste of these Japanese-Malaysian fusion foods.



SPICY PREMIUM ROLL

Remember the first time you tried wasabi? Bet it made your eyes water and your nose burn. For an explosion of flavours, Ozeki's spicy premium roll is like culinary gun powder. Four miniature towers of sushi rice piled with slivers of salmon and seared Japanese scallops are wedged together with spicy *kimuchi* and Malaysia's small but super hot chili, the bird's eye or *cili padi* for a smack in the tastebuds.

JACKFRUIT EBI MAKI

Known for its bold fusion dishes, Hei Sushi doesn't hold back. Their Jackfruit Ebi Maki is the perfect combo of crisp prawn tempura, crunchy cucumber wrapped in seaweed and sushi rice, and topped with slivers of jackfruit for a one-of-a-kind taste experience.

FUSION ONIGIRI

Considered a convenience food, *onigiri* are triangular shaped rice balls wrapped in *nori* and traditionally filled with Japanese ingredients like salted salmon or *bonito* flakes. Their staple ingredients being rice, something Japan shares in common with Malaysia, makes these satisfying snacks highly adaptable to Malaysian foods like *sambal* and *rendang*. Kawan Food turns out ready-to-eat *onigiri* with spicy fillings like Nasi Lemak with Sambal Ikan Bilis, Nasi Lemak with Serunding Kelapa and Udang, and Chicken Rice, while popular Japanese convenience store chain Family Mart carries Sambal Telur, Chicken Rendang and Beef Rendang versions. We think it's the best thing since sliced bread.

Quite unlike the toast served at Malaysian kopitiam, Shibuya-style honey toast isn't eaten with half-boiled eggs or coconut jam. The size of a small loaf, this massive butter-fried treat is best enjoyed shared. Sweet, crunchy and honey-coated on the outside and soft on the inside, it sometimes comes with a choice of fillings like fruit and is usually topped with ice cream or whipped cream.

We love Miru Dessert Café's Pandan Coconut version. Resembling a cold winter day on the outside but with a melt-in your-mouth sensation on the inside, this fragrant pandan-infused bread is topped with ice cream and sprinkled with a generous helping of grated coconut.

DURIAN MOCHI & ICE CREAM

While the strong taste profiles that hail from Malaysian ingredients like belacan and stinkbean don't sit well with the delicate flavours of Japan's savory specialties,

ingredients like pandan, *gula Melaka* and fruit like durian and jackfruit adapt well to Japanese desserts. Take Sushi King's Durian Mochi: soft, gooey durian-flavoured filling, wrapped in glutinous rice skin or *mochi* and deep-fried. One stab with a wooden chopstick and the *mochi*'s pillowy texture gives way leaking bitter sweet durian. Served with a side of ice cream, would you expect anything less from a homegrown chain of Japanese *kaiten* or revolving sushi restaurants?

Run by a husband and wife team from Kuala Pilah, Azizi Abdul Muin and Zuriati Sulaiman combined the traditional Ramadhan-Raya specialty of lemang with the Japanese technique of preparing sushi to create this unexpected hit. Filling the long sticky rice roll with food combinations like *serunding*, *rendang daging* and even durian, Lemang Sushi is now sold chilled or frozen in selected supermarkets. Here the use of bamboo has been removed in the at home cooking process, instead the lemang sushi can be steamed or microwaved for convenience. Just remember to peel the banana leaf skin before consuming. Unlike *nori* or seaweed used in Japanese food preparation, banana leaf isn't meant to be eaten.

KAKIGORI

A dessert of flavoured shaved ice with toppings, *kakigori* was favoured by Japan's well-to-do until mass refrigeration came along. Usually served in Japan during the sizzling hot summer months of July and August, it is the perfect antidote for Malaysia's year round high temperatures.

Available at their Setapak outlet, Mykori Dessert Cafe's

indulgent multilayered offering piles luscious durian fruit and fluffy durian cheesecake on top of D24-infused shaved ice that spills over with lashings of whipped cream, a scoop of ice cream and sprinkled almonds.

Kakigōri's eponymously named outlet typically serves their version of *kakigori* topped with traditional Japanese ingredients like Marukyu-Koyamaen *matcha* from Kyoto, *kinako* or toasted soy powder and Japanese pumpkin. Though its Apam Balik *kakigori* is no longer available, its seasonal durian version looks set to take its place.

The Art Of Bonsai

Fancy a forest but only have a small garden? Bonsai, the Japanese art of cultivating trees that are tiny versions of themselves makes it possible.









Malaysians have traditionally been avid gardeners. Until, that is, we gave up our gardens for convenient condominium living and increasingly adopted lifestyles that left little time for personal pursuits. The increasing necessity for urban gardening and the interest in terraniums could rekindle our love for all things green. But for some, gardening has always been a passion, and few green-fingered hobbyists are as passionate as Bonsai practitioners.

WHAT IS BONSAI?

An ancient Japanese art form that originated from China, Bonsai is the careful cultivation of a plant to resemble a miniature replica of its full-grown self, according to Japanese tradition and principles. Basically, it is the mini-me of plant growing.

In Japan, the practise dates back to the 13th century but only spread internationally in the early 20th century to the Americas and Europe when Japanese immigrants brought the art form with them.

Rather than growing specific strains

genetically designed to develop into small versions of their larger counterparts, known as dwarves, Bonsai plants are grown from regular seeds or cuttings. The most beautiful are judged on criteria such as its proportions – to look like a miniature version of itself; asymmetry – like the Japanese art of Ikebana or flower arranging asymmetry is prized; and a natural appearance, with no visible sign of human intervention.

Commonly displayed as a single small tree, sometimes Bonsai plants can be grouped together to create a miniature forest, or grown in or around rock formations to provide the appearance of a wild and rugged landscape.

WHO DOES IT?

To achieve this takes considerable effort, which is why the practice of Bonsai was once favoured by the older and more affluent strata of society, who had both time and money to spend.

These days however, the appeal of Bonsai is universal and attracts enthusiasts from all walks of life, including the younger generation. Here in Malaysia, there are two main Bonsai societies, chiefly the Bonsai & Suiseki Society and Persatuan Seniman Bonsai Malaysia, which originated in Kelantan. There are also numerous Bonsai nurseries and stores that offer workshops and host talks by Bonsai specialists.

Though all Bonsai growers take enormous pride in the fruits of their labours, even entering competitions, like travel, Bonsai is not just about the destination but is about the journey. Practitioners take great pleasure in the leisurely pace with which their plant develops and the meticulousness and level of detail required to sculpt it over time. Woody perennials and shrubs, particularly those with small leaves and needles are best suited to Bonsai cultivation. In Malaysia, Wrightia Religiosa, or Water Jasmine or Shui Mei as its more commonly referred to, is a popular choice especially as it has small, fragrant white flowers.

HOW BONSAI IS ACHIEVED

The art of Bonsai requires considerable skill and patience. Planting within a small container and regular pruning of the root system, trunk and branches, and trimming of the leaves limitd the plant's growth. The creative use of clamps and placement of wires to mould roots and branches also lets the grower shape the tree into its desired form. All of this takes time of course. Even sprouting a plant can take several years. But with dedication and care, each plant can be meticulously crafted into a tiny version of its original.

Additionally, the practise requires specialised tools that are more expensive than conventional gardening equipment, and volcanic soil sourced from Indonesia is preferred over local sand or potting soil. While this sounds costly, for Bonsai fans, the investment is worth it in the end.

Apart from attending plant shows and exhibitions, societies such as the ones here in Malaysia also organise trips to the homes of fellow Bonsai enthusiasts to admire their Bonsai garden, and frequently meet to bond over knowledge sharing and a mutual love of these very unique trees.



Mr. Danny Chong is a committed Bonsai enthusiast and the proprietor of Zen Bonsai, a plant specialist that cultivates and sells exquisite Bonsai and rainforest terrariums. He has been practicing the art of Bonsai for 25 years; With Dreams spoke to him about this unique art form.

What drove your passion for Bonsai?

I would buy plants and they would fail to survive. So I was naturally curious. Then I read American horticulturist and master Bonsai cultivator John Yoshio Naka's two books, 'Bonsai Techniqus I' and 'II'.

What was it about Yoshio Naka's books that inspired you?

Naka-san's technique is very unique, and probably the best I've come across. After understanding the nature of the plants' habitats, my plants started thriving.

Is cultivating Bonsai plants a difficult or expensive hobby to get into?

It can be difficult to get into but it doesn't have to be expensive. You can get a nice plant for RM98. For a small plant you only need a pair of scissors to start. To pick up the knowledge and skills, I have conducted lots of free Bonsai workshops to share with interested members of the public on how they can go about creating their own Bonsai.

What advise can you give to beginners?

Taking care of your Bonsai requires discipline. Also, be patient.

What do you enjoy about practising the art of Bonsai?

Working with plants is very relaxing and I get a lot of satisfaction out of seeing a beautiful Bonsai.



Building the Honda Legacy

From Japan to across the globe, including Malaysia, Honda has embarked on an illustrious journey since 1948.

he son of a skilled blacksmith and weaver, Soichiro Honda started his career in automotive engineering by working as an apprentice at the age of fifteen. Learning under the tutelage of Yuzo Sakakibara at Art Shokai, Tokyo's renowned automobile repair workshop, Soichiro Honda discovered his dexterity with the tools and developed an instinctive sensitivity towards cars.

His enthusiasm for hard work and ability

to come up with new ideas quickly got him noticed by Sakakibara, the owner, who provided the young Soichiro Honda many more opportunities to learn and grow.

Sakakibara was a good teacher, both as an engineer and as a businessman. It is here that Soichiro Honda experienced a great deal on managing customers and manufacturing processes. At seventeen, he got his first taste of making racing cars under Sakakibara's leadership, which began Soichiro Honda's passion for motorsports.



Soichiro Honda's challenging spirit and passion for automotives resulted in the first Honda prototype that led to many more innovations.



Soichiro Honda pioneered the Honda brand with Takeo Fujisawa.

Soichiro Honda's time at Art Shokai played a huge influence in cultivating his pride in technical ability and precision. No stranger to trials and tribulations, Soichiro went from repairing to creating and overcame many failures in his journey of producing piston rings.

By 1946, Soichiro established Honda Technical Research Institute and sold auxiliary engines for bicycles. The product sparked the origins of Honda, the brand, as he went on to build his first motorised bicycle and eventually developed his first motorcycle, the Dream D Type, upon establishing the Honda Motor Co., Ltd, in 1948.

Honda's reputation in motorcycle production grew rapidly and soon the company was producing more than 1,000 'Dreams' and more than 5,000 'Cubs'. Soichiro, however, was not contented after observing a huge gap in technical proficiencies between Japanese makers and foreign brands. In order to realise his dream of manufacturing products that exceeded international standards, he started importing machine tools and learning from his global counterparts.

In Malaysia, the first Honda cub debuted as a result of the late Tan Sri Dato' Loh Boon Siew's chance meeting with Soichiro Honda in Japan. Loh saw a market for Malaysia and decided to set up a Honda subsidiary in Penang on Pitt Street, becoming the sole distributor for Honda motorcycles in the country.

The popularity of using motorised transport encouraged more businesses that sold motorcycles in the early 60's. Some of the pioneer Honda dealers in Malaysia, such as Ban Hoe Seng in Ipoh, Kah Motor Co. in Penang and Ban Lee Heng in Negeri Sembilan, were instrumental in introducing the Honda brand to more Malaysians in the early years, just by selling the affordable and revolutionary Honda Cubs.

Spread over 80 acres of land in the Pegoh Industrial Park, Honda Malaysia's Pegoh Plant has a total built-up area of 13 acres.

Their efforts were put to the test with the introduction of Honda cars by the end of the 1960's. Honda Motor had just debuted its first mini passenger car, the N360, in October 1966 and was followed by the Honda 1300 small passenger car by October 1968.
